| Visitor Management (including visitors, individuals accompanying patients and new companions) | Visitors and individuals accompanying patients should receive a COVID-19 vaccine booster. Those who do not have symptoms or exposure history should provide a negative result from a self-paid at-home rapid test taken on the same day if they have not received a booster dose. New companions of residents should have received a booster dose. Current companions in the facilities who have not received a booster dose cannot be replaced by new companions and should take a self-paid test every 7 days. | Regardless of vaccination status, testing is cancelled for visitors, those accompanying patients and new companions if they have no symptoms or exposure history |

| Resident Entry and Exit Management Measures | New residents need to provide a negative result from a self-paid test prior to being admitted to the facility. They will be isolated for 7 days starting from the day after their admission. A self-paid test has to be taken on the 7th day. Those who test negative can be released from isolation. For those who stayed overnight outside without going abroad and have been exposed to COVID-19 within 7 days before returning to the facility: Submit a negative result from a self-paid test upon return to the facility Self-paid tests should be taken on the 3rd or 4th day as well as the 7th day after returning to the facility For residents who travel abroad: A negative test result taken prior to returning to the facility should be provided They are isolated for 7 days starting from the day after their arrival in Taiwan and can be released from their isolation with a negative test result. Regular management measures will be applicable afterwards Residents transferred or discharged from the hospital to the facility should undergo government-funded rapid test if they are not confirmed cases (residents who cannot take tests by themselves or with the assistance of their caregivers can take a government-funded medical antigen rapid test instead). Self-paid tests should be taken on the 3rd or 4th day as well as the 7th day after being transferred or returning to the facility. The facility can evaluate the necessity of giving self-paid tests to residents who frequently stay overnight outside. | ■ All current measures are cancelled ■ In principle, testing is not necessary for new residents or residents who stayed overnight outside the facility. COVID-19 symptoms or exposure history of residents will be evaluated, recorded and handled accordingly by the facility ■ Testing and/or evaluation by medical professionals are recommended if COVID-19 symptoms are present |
